Annual Elder's Day May 18th, 2024



Narragansett Indian Tribal youth, grades 5-12, may submit one piece in any medium, contemporary or traditional. The piece should express their Narragansett identity and community.

Submissions may be dropped of at Tomaquag Museum up to May 16th OR the senior building on Friday May 17th between 4-6pm in order to qualify. Submissions will be split into two categories based on age range.

Annual Elder's Day May 18th, 2024

The Narragansett Indian Silver Clouds in partnership with the Tomaquag Museum invite you to participate in the 2024 Narragansett Youth Art Contest! To encourage the continuation of our traditional arts, we have two contests this year. An art competition for youth grades 9-12 and an art contest for youth grades 5-8. Each youth may submit one piece in any medium from traditional to contemporary that expresses their Narragansett identity and community. Art showing and contest will be held on Elder's Day, May 18, 2024.

Art Contest Guidelines

Youth grades 5-12 may submit one piece in any medium from traditional to contemporary that expresses their Narragansett identity and community. Beadwork, basketry, weaving, pottery, painting, drawing, collage, photography, wampum work, quillwork, carving, sculpting, etc! Parents may help guide you, but you must have completed the work on your own. All entries are kept anonymous for judging by the Elders. Three winners in each category will be announced at the end of the Elder's Day Program on May 18th. Prizes are as follows:

Grades 9-12

1st Place winner will receive \$100
2nd Place winner will receive \$75
3rd Place winner will receive \$50
Consolation prizes for all other entrants

Grades 5-8

1st Place winner will receive \$35
2nd Place winner will receive \$25
3rd Place winner will receive \$15
Consolation prizes for all other entrants

All winning art will be kept on display at the senior center for one month and then returned to entrants. All others can then be taken home at the end of day or picked up from the Tomaquag Museum anytime after. Call to arrange pickup time. If not picked up within 30 days, we will consider the piece forfeit.

How To Enter

Complete the registration and submission forms and return with your finished art work. Forms can be picked up at the senior center or you can download online at the website below. Entries can be dropped off at the Tomaquag Museum prior to May 17th OR on May 17th between 4:00pm-6:00pm at the Narragansett Tribe Senior Center. No exceptions.
